Japan Credit Rating Agency, Ltd. (JCR) announces the following credit rating.

Rationale

- (1) Nippon Life Insurance Company is the core company of Japan's largest life insurance group, Nippon Life Group. Having Taiju Life Insurance Company Limited, Nippon Wealth Life Insurance Company Limited, HANASAKU LIFE INSURANCE Co., Ltd., MLC Limited in Australia, and other companies under its umbrella, it operates overseas insurance, asset management and other businesses, centered on domestic insurance business. Recently, there have been moves to strengthen areas around life insurance, such as nursing care business, and to accelerate overseas expansion. JCR rates issuer rating of Nippon Life Insurance at the same level as the Group's overall creditworthiness, which is considered equivalent to "AA+" based on the assessment on the strong operating base in Japan, stable earnings power on the back of a large amount of policies in force, high capital adequacy relative to risks, and others. The Group's business performance of policies has been strong and new business value has been steadily accumulating. The capital is large and it is highly capable of absorbing various risks. Sensitivity of economic value-based indicators has been controlled, partly because the Group has made steady progress in reducing interest rate risk.
- (2) The Group has a relatively strong market position and competitive edge. In order to respond to the diversification of customers' needs, it has a "domestic five-company structure" including Nissay Plus SSI (small-amount, short-term insurance), and has firmly established multiple and specialized sales channels based on its sales staff of approximately 50,000. JCR believes that the Group will continue to maintain its business base and competitiveness by developing a product supply and sales support system by the Group as a whole and promoting consulting activities that combine face-to-face and digital approaches in addition to strengthening the bancassurance channel and agency channel. In Japan, it has been diversifying its business into areas such as nursing care, while overseas it has been accelerating the pace of its business, including MLC. The diversification of its business base and revenue sources is expected to have a positive effect on its creditworthiness in the long term, and JCR will watch the status of PMI and other developments from a medium-term perspective.
- (3) The Group's earnings power is relatively high and stable. The product mix of in-force policies has been gradually changing through focus on sales of protection products and appropriate strategies such as the flexible introduction of third-sector product. With interest rates rising, it also sells savings products in response to needs. The increase in single-premium products at Nippon Wealth Life Insurance and other factors have contributed to the continued increase in annualized new business premium, but sales of protection products by Nippon Life Insurance on a non-consolidated basis have been sluggish. JCR will watch whether it can expand its business performance of policies, mainly in the area of protection products, and steadily build up new business value.
- (4) JCR considers that the Group's capital adequacy is equivalent to the upper AA range and its ESR is at a level that can maintain sufficient soundness even under considerable stress. Although the generation of goodwill related to large-scale investments in the US may push down the capital level, JCR believes that a level that matches the rating will be maintained. Although its large stockholdings make it susceptible to stock price movements, it has been making efforts to control price fluctuation risk. In addition, it has been working to reduce interest rate risk by narrowing the duration gap, and the sensitivity of the ESR to interest rates has been controlled. As the number of group companies in Japan and overseas is increasing, the importance of global and group-wide ERM has increased. The Group has a policy of strategically utilizing capital, and JCR believes that the Group will maintain a

balance between realizing growth investments and maintaining soundness based on ERM management in a disciplined manner.

 - A) Business Bases

The likelihood of a given debt payment is highly conditional to its issuer's business bases - how they can be maintained/ expanded into the future and thereby secure earnings and cash flows in adequacy and in a sustainable way.

B) Financial Grounds and Asset Quality

The likelihood of debt payment is highly dependent on the degree of the issuer's indebtedness and loss absorption capacity in terms of equity capital. Also notable is that a financial institution might see a significant loss of financial grounds as a result of changes in value of the assets under its possession.

C) Liquidity Positions

The likelihood of debt payment is highly dependent on the adequacy of the issuer's cash and other sources of repayment (liquidity positions).

D) Related Parties' Status and Stance of Support/ Assistance for the Issuer

The likelihood of debt payment is affected one way or the other by the issuer's related parties such as parent company, subsidiary, guarantor, and the government of the issuer's business domicile, etc. - by their own conditions and/ or position of support/assistance for the issuer.

E) Order of Seniority in Debt Payment

The likelihood of debt payment can be different between given debts of the same issuer. The likelihood of debt payment for an individual debt is dependent on the issuer's discretion, and/ or its rank relative to other debts of the same issuer in the order of seniority in principal/ interest payment which is determined by design as financial product or by laws, etc.

A) Business Bases


The credit rating is subject to alteration if there is improvement or deterioration of the issuer's business bases, since its revenue, etc. may improve or deteriorate by the change in its business management policies, clients' preferences, competitive situation, or a technological innovation. The resultant alteration of the credit rating is usually by a notch, with possibility of a few notches if and when the change in the business bases is large.

B) Financial Grounds and Asset Quality

The credit rating is subject to alteration if the issuer increases/ decreases its debt/ capital or vice versa and thereby makes its individual debt payment liability less or more bearable and its loss absorption capacity into the future decreased or increased. Also, the changes in the quality of asset under the issuer's holding may affect the credit rating, since such changes could raise or lower the likelihood of future loss of the issuer's financial grounds. The resultant alteration of the credit rating is usually by a notch, with possibility of a few notches if and when the change in the financial grounds and/ or asset quality is large.

C) Liquidity Positions

The credit rating is subject to alteration if there is a change in the issuer's financial management policy or in the relations with fund procurement sources and the change thereby makes its liquidity positions improve or deteriorate. The resultant alteration of the credit rating is usually by a notch, with possibility of a few notches if and when the change is large.



The credit rating is subject to alteration if there is a change in the issuer's parent company or subsidiary, guarantor or other provider of credit enhancement, or the government of the issuer's business domicile, or other related parties' own conditions and/ or position of support/ assistance for the issuer, and the change thereby makes its business bases, financial grounds and/ or liquidity positions improve or deteriorate, and/ or making the effectiveness of guarantee and other credit enhancement improve or deteriorate. The resultant alteration of the credit rating is usually a notch, with possibility of a few notches if and when the change is large.

E) Order of Seniority in Debt Payment and Non-Payment Forgiven by Contract

The credit rating is subject to alteration if there is a change in the rated debt's status in the order of seniority relative to other debts caused by the improvement/ deterioration of the issuer's financial condition. The resultant alteration of the credit rating is usually a notch, with possibility of a few notches if and when the change is large. Also, in case of the financial products for which non-payment of interest/ principal is contractually permissible, the credit rating is subject to alteration if and when the likelihood of such non-payment is projected to increase or decrease. The resultant alteration of the credit rating could be by a notch but often as much as a few notches.

F) Rise and Fall in General Economy and Markets

The credit rating is subject to alteration if there is a rise/ fall in the general economy and/ or the markets inducing the issuer's revenues/ expenses to increase/ decrease and vice versa, etc. The resultant alteration of the credit rating is usually by a notch, with possibility of a few notches if and when the change is exceptionally large.

G) Various Events

The credit rating is subject to alteration on occurrence of various events, such as change in the issuer's major shareholders, M&A and other organizational change, accident, violation of the law, litigation, legal/ regulatory change, natural disaster, etc., which are unforeseeable at the time when the credit rating is determined, causing a significant change on the issuer's business bases, financial grounds, etc. The resultant alteration of the credit rating could be by a notch but more often than not as much as a few notches.

The credit rating herewith presented could be changed if and when the assumptions made at the time of its determination turn out to be inaccurate with regard to the issuer's business bases and powers of earning or cash flow generation, etc. The resultant change of the credit rating is most likely by a notch, as JCR speculates, but possibly as much as a few notches if the development is rapid in improvement or deterioration of the issuer's business bases on some drastic change in the operational environments, etc.

B) Financial Grounds and Asset Quality

The credit rating herewith presented could be changed if and when the assumptions made at the time of its determination turn out to be inaccurate with regard to the issuer's financial grounds and asset quality. The resultant change of the credit rating is most likely by a notch, as JCR speculates, but



possibly as much as a few notches if the development is rapid in improvement or deterioration of the issuer's financial grounds and/ or asset quality on some drastic change in its business bases.

C) Liquidity Risks

The credit rating herewith presented could be changed if and when the assumptions made at the time of its determination turn out to be inaccurate with regard to the issuer's liquidity positions. The resultant change of the credit rating is most likely by a notch, as JCR speculates, but possibly as much as a few notches if the development is rapid in improvement or deterioration of the issuer's liquidity positions on some drastic change in its financial management policy or relations with fund procurement sources, etc.

D) Related Parties' Status and Stance of Support/ Assistance for the Issuer

The credit rating herewith presented could be changed if and when the assumptions made at the time of its determination turn out to be inaccurate with regard to the issuer's parent company or subsidiaries, guarantor or other providers of credit enhancement, the government of the issuer's business domicile or other related parties' status and stance of support/ assistance for the issuer. The resultant change of the credit rating is most likely by a notch, as JCR speculates, but possibly as much as a few notches if there is a major change on the part of related parties, such as replacement, disappearance, some drastic improvement/ deterioration of financial grounds/ balances, etc.

E) Rise and Fall in General Economy and Markets

The credit rating herewith presented could be changed if and when the assumptions made at the time of its determination turn out to be inaccurate with regard to the prospects of general economy and markets.
